

CS Herediano (CRC) vs. LA Galaxy (USA)

Estadio Nacional (CRC)

CS Herediano and LA Galaxy will face each other for the third time in the Concacaf Champions Cup. The MLS side remains unbeaten in this matchup with one win and one draw, having eliminated CS Herediano in the 2012-13 quarterfinals.

CS Herediano advanced to the Round of 16 after completing a dramatic comeback against Real Salt Lake with a 2-1 aggregate victory. It was their second-ever win on U.S. soil. Their first came on September 20, 2011, when they defeated Seattle Sounders 1-0 on Matchday 8 of Group D, thanks to a goal from Yosimar Arias. This was also their tenth encounter against an MLS club, securing their fourth victory, with Real Salt Lake (2) suffering the most losses against Herediano among MLS teams.

For the first time in three two-legged series, CS Herediano eliminated an MLS club. They previously fell to LA Galaxy in the 2013 quarterfinals and to Atlanta United in the 2019 Round of 16.

CS Herediano will play in the Round of 16 for the fourth time in its history. They were eliminated twice, against Tigres UANL in 2018 and Atlanta United in 2019, but advanced once against Robinhood in 2024.

Herediano remains unbeaten in the first legs of its Round of 16 ties, all played at home, with two wins and one draw. They have also scored at least two goals in each match at this stage, drawing 2-2 against Tigres UANL in 2018, winning 3-1 against Atlanta United in 2019, and securing a 2-0 victory over Robinhood in 2024.

Of Herediano's last 10 goals in the 2024 and 2025 editions, only one was scored in the first half. That goal came from Honduran defender Getsel Montes against Robinhood in the 2024 Round of 16. Half of those goals were left-footed strikes, and 60 percent were scored by substitutes.

Concacaf Champions Cup appearances in all formats included (17) in 1962, 1975, 1980, 1987, 1989, 1994, 2009-2010, 2011-2012, 2012-2013, 2013-2014, 2014-2015, 2015-2016, 2016-2017, 2018, 2019, 2024, and 2025.

Best result: semifinalist in 2014-2015.

Fastest goal in Concacaf Champions Cup 2025: Elías Aguilar at 69 minutes and 35 seconds against Real Salt Lake in Round One, Second Leg.



Players to watch:

Elías Aguilar from Costa Rica. Scored the equalizer in Herediano's comeback victory against Real Salt Lake in Round One of 2025, reaching four career goals for the club in the Concacaf Champions Cup. Aguilar had not scored in the tournament since August 21, 2014, when he found the net against Isidro Metapán of El Salvador on Matchday 2 of Group 7, a gap of 10 years, six months, and a few days. He is also Herediano's all-time appearance leader since the format change, with 28 matches played, including one goal against LA Galaxy in the 2012-2013 quarterfinals.

Allan Cruz from Costa Rica. Took 1 shot and completed 94 total passes with 89 percent accuracy in the series against Real Salt Lake. The midfielder has 22 appearances in Concacaf club tournaments and has scored 2 goals. He won the 2018 Scotiabank Concacaf League title.

Getsel Montes from Honduras. Scored a goal in the first leg of the 2024 Round of 16, when Herediano defeated SV Robinhood 2-0 at home. The Honduran defender has netted 5 goals in 22 international club appearances.



LA Galaxy qualified directly for the Round of 16 as the 2024 MLS Cup champion. This will mark their 11th appearance and their first since the 2015-16 edition. Their best result came in 2000 when they lifted the trophy as Concacaf Champions.

The Los Angeles-based club has won 50 percent of its matches since the tournament format changed in 2008-09, securing 15 victories in 30 games. They have participated in five editions since the competition was restructured.

LA Galaxy is currently on a four-match winless streak in the Concacaf Champions Cup with three draws and one loss. Their last victory came in a commanding 5-0 win over Comunicaciones in the 2015-16 Group D stage.

LA Galaxy has not won an away match in the Concacaf Champions Cup in its last five outings, with three losses and two draws. Their last road victory was a 3-0 triumph over CS Cartaginés, with goals from John McBean, Chandler Hoffman, and Laurent Courtois, in the Group H stage of the 2013-14 edition.

Concacaf Champions Cup appearances in all formats included (11) in 1997, 1999, 2000, 2003, 2006, 2010-11, 2011-12, 2012-13, 2013-14, 2015-16, and 2025.

Debut: 1997 (Runner-up).

Last appearance: 2015-16 (Quarterfinals).

Concacaf Champions Cup record in all formats included 44 matches played, 20 wins, 11 draws, 13 losses, 74 goals for, and 57 goals against.

Best result: Champion in 2000, runner-up in 1997. Semifinalist in 2012-13.

Top scorers in the Round of 16: Alexi Lalas from the USA with 2, Carlos Ruiz from Guatemala with 1.

Players to watch:

Gabriel Pec from Brazil. The forward scored 19 goals in 38 matches during the 2024 Major League Soccer season, his first campaign since moving from Brazilian football. He also netted 2 goals in 3 appearances in the 2024 Leagues Cup.

Joseph Paintsil from Ghana. Tallied 14 goals and 8 assists in 34 matches during his debut season in North American football after moving from Belgium. His contributions spanned both the MLS regular season and the MLS Cup Playoffs.

Marco Reus from Germany. Set for his first-ever appearance in the Concacaf Champions Cup. The veteran played 15 seasons in Germany's Bundesliga, representing Borussia Mönchengladbach and Borussia Dortmund before making his move to MLS in 2024.
