

The FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup will be the 8th edition and the first time it will take place in the Dominican Republic, the second in the Caribbean (after Trinidad and Tobago 2010), and the third time it will be hosted by a Concacaf Member Association after Trinidad and Tobago 2010 and Costa Rica 2014.

How they qualified: Host country.

The Dominican Republic will be one of the debuting teams alongside Ecuador, Kenya, and Poland.

Group A: Dominican Republic, Ecuador, New Zealand, and Nigeria.

The Dominican Republic will face its group rivals for the first time.

FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup record: GP-19 W-8 D-5 L-6 (GF-46 GA-26).

Group B: United States, Spain, Republic of Korea, and Colombia.

vs. Spain: They will face each other for the first time in the FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup. They played 3 friendlies between 2019 and 2022, with 1 win each and 1 draw. Spain won 4-3 in 2019 (14-SEP), the USA won 2-0 in 2022 (23-AUG), and they drew 1-1 in 2022 (25-AUG).

vs. Republic of Korea: This will be their second meeting in the FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup. They were rivals in the 2008 New Zealand edition, with the USA winning 4-2 (Courtney Verloo x2, Kristen Mewis, and Vicki DiMartino; Lee Hyun-Young x2) in the quarterfinals at Waikato Stadium in Hamilton (9-NOV-2008). They also met in a 2018 friendly, which ended in a 2-2 draw.

**vs. Colombia:** They will face each other for the first time in the FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup. They played an international friendly on October 10, 2018, with the United States winning 4-1.

## FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup record: GP-23 W-8 D-6 L-9 (GF-33 GA-33).

**Group C: Mexico, DPR Korea, Kenya, and England.** 

They will face their group rivals for the first time in the FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup.

They played an international friendly against England on October 10, 2028, with England winning 4-0.
