

Cuba vs. Mexico

Estadio León, León

This will be the 11th match in the history of the Concacaf Men's Under-20 Championship between these two teams, and Mexico has never lost to Cuba, with 8 wins and 2 draws, scoring 21 goals and conceding only 2.

Mexico won the last 6 encounters, scoring 19 goals and conceding only 2, keeping a clean sheet in 80% of those matches. Cuba was only able to score in 2 of the 10 previous matches: in Guatemala 1988 (a defeat in the last group match) and in Jamaica 2015 (a defeat in Group B).

Mexico's highest-scoring victory against Cuba was 9-1 with goals by Alejandro Díaz (2), Guillermo Martínez (2), Hirving Lozano (2), José David Ramírez (2), and Luis Márquez; at the Montego Bay Sports Complex in Montego Bay on January 10, 2015.

In addition to their encounters at the CMU20, they were also rivals at the Central American and Caribbean Games in Mexico 1990 (1-0) and Puerto Rico 1993 (2-0), both won by Mexico.

Cuba won 1 of the last 6 matches in regulation time at CMU20 (2 Draws-3 Losses), which was in the closing of Group A of Mexico 2024: 3-0 vs. Jamaica (Michael Camejo, David Pérez, and Karel Pérez).

Cuba achieved 8 wins in its last 15 matches in the history of the tournament. During this period, they only drew against Costa Rica at the start of Group A (1-1) and Honduras (1-1) in the quarter-finals, both in Mexico 2024.

Participation in semifinals lost the 2 semifinals it played, both on Mexican soil: 1-0 vs. Mexico in 1973 (Feb 25) and 2-0 vs. USA in 2013 (Mar 1).

Considering the editions with a final match, Cuba participated in the final of Canada 1974, where they lost 1-0 to Mexico, achieving one of their best performances in the history of the competition.

Players to Watch:

Samuel Rodríguez. He is the top scorer for the Cubans in the current edition of CMU20 with (2). He scored in the group stage and quarter-finals. He has made 10 shots.

Karel Pérez. He is the team leader in recovered balls with (17). He scored a penalty goal in the 3-0 victory against Jamaica in the closing of Group A of Mexico 2024.

Michael Camejo. Scored the first goal in the victory over Jamaica in the last round of the group stage. He made 112 passes and 3 shots and has started in every match.

Yurdy Hodelin. Made 5 saves against Honduras in the quarter-finals. Ahead of the semifinals, he has made 16 saves.

Mexico is unbeaten in 9 CMU20 matches with 6 wins and 3 draws. They lost 2 of the last 39 matches in the tournament against the United States: 1-0 in Group D of Costa Rica 2017 and 2-0 in the final of United States 2018.

Mexico was the leader in shots during the group stage with 45, with an efficiency of 15.6% (21 of those shots on goal, 15 deflected, 2 hit the posts, and 7 ended in goals).

Participations in semifinals: Mexico has played 7 semifinals with 100% efficiency (6 in regular time and 1 in penalties). The only definition from the penalty spot was against Canada 4-3 after a 1-1 tie in the United States 1980.

Mexico's 7 Semifinals: in Mexico 1973 (vs. Cuba), Puerto Rico 1976 (vs. Guatemala), Honduras 1978 (vs. Honduras), United States 1980 (vs. Canada), Trinidad 1984 (vs. United States), Guatemala 2011 (vs. Panama), and Mexico 2013 (vs. El Salvador).

Players to Watch:

Diego Ochoa. He scored a goal in the quarterfinals against Costa Rica to temporarily tie the match. He made 122 passes before the semifinals and was the Mexican player with the most passes (101) in the group stage.

Amaury Morales. He is the Mexican player with the highest goal participation in the tournament (2 goals and 2 assists) and has made 5 shots in his 4 appearances and completed 89% of his passes.

Yael Padilla. He is one of the players with the most shots (12), along with Santiago López (Canada), Roberto Osorto (Honduras). He was the leader in shots with 6 in the quarterfinals and scored the first Mexican goal in the current edition (vs. Haiti in the 4-0 victory).

César Garza. To date, he has made 120 passes in 3 appearances with an efficiency of 92%. In addition to 4 ball recoveries, he has received 7 fouls (2.3 per game).
