

Santa Fe (PAN) vs. V. Whitecaps (CAN)

Group B, September 4, 2024 Estadio Rommel Fernández, Panama City.



Santa Fe FC debuted with a 0-2 loss against San Diego Wave (María Sánchez and Kristen McNabb) at the Rommel Fernández Stadium in Panama City.

They conceded 2 goals from 11 shots (one goal in each half, both headers).

The Panamanian champions managed 44% possession in their first match.

Santa Fe, coached by Argentine Fernando Clavero, took 6 shots, one on target and 5 off.

Outstanding players:

- María Murillo (PAN) took 50% of Santa Fe FC's shots against San Diego Wave (3 of 6). The defender completed 5 of the 20 clearances.
- **Yenith Bailey (PAN)**, the team's captain, again demonstrated her skills with 4 saves and 3 clearances. She was the winner of the Golden Glove Award at the 2018 Concacaf W Championship after making 24 saves.
- **Karla Rivas (PAN)**, the forward, led in recovered balls (3) against San Diego Wave along with Nuria Márquez. The 21-year-old completed 84% of her passes and made 2 clearances in the first match.



Vancouver Whitecaps FC will play their third match in the Concacaf W Champions Cup, their second in the group stage after overcoming the Preliminary Round against Alianza Women's (1-0).

Vancouver Whitecaps debuted in the group stage with a 0-7 loss to Club América at the Ciudad de los Deportes Stadium.

To date, they have made 8 shots and scored one penalty goal in the Preliminary Round (Emily Wong in the first half).

In the loss against América Femenil, they received 16 shots and conceded 7 goals.

Outstanding players:

- **Emily Wong (CAN)**. Scored the first for Vancouver Whitecaps against Alianza FC. The 17-year-old midfielder made 4 ball recoveries and completed 86% of her passes.
- **Kaylee Hunter (CAN)**. Made three shots. The 16-year-old midfielder scored 4 goals in her 5 matches at the U-17 Concacaf Championship in Mexico 2024.
- **Bridget Mutipula (CAN)**. She is the team leader in recovered balls (10) in two appearances. The defender made 7 Ball recovareis against América.

Thorns (USA) vs. América (MEX)

Group B, September 4, 2024 Providence Park, Portland.



Portland Thorns, based in Portland, Oregon, will make their debut in the CWCC 2024-25.

The team, three-time champions of the NWSL (National Women's Soccer League), qualified with the second-best record in the 2023 NWSL Shield.

Founded in 2012, the club has won the NWSL championship three times (2013, 2017, and 2022) and was the runner-up in 2018.

They also won the Fall Series trophy in 2020 and the NWSL Challenge Cup in 2021.

They are one of the three representatives from the National Women's Soccer League (NWSL) participating in the inaugural edition of the Concacaf Women's Champions Cup 2024-25.

- **Jessie Fleming (CAN)**. Scored 20 goals in 134 appearances for the Canadian national team, winning a Gold Medal at Tokyo 2020. She represented the country in U-17 (Golden Ball at the 2013 Concacaf Championship), U-20, and U-23 teams. Played in 5 matches at the 2024 Concacaf Gold Cup W.
- **Sophia Smith (USA).** Has been playing for Portland Thorns FC since 2020 after standing out at Stanford University. She participated in her first FIFA World Cup in Australia/New Zealand in 2023 (scored a brace against Vietnam). Scored 23 goals and made 11 assists in 55 appearances for the U.S. women's national team. In the 2024 Concacaf Gold Cup W, she scored 1 goal against Canada.
- Olivia Moultrie (USA). Was part of the roster that won the Concacaf Gold Cup W with the United States, where she scored 2 goals in 2 appearances. The 18-year-old forward was part of the U-15 and U-20 U.S. national teams, participating in the FIFA World Cup Costa Rica 2022.

CLUB AMÉRICA (MEX)

Club América debuted with a 7-0 victory against Vancouver Whitecaps (Sarah Luebbert, Nicolette Hernández, Kiana Palacios, Scarlett Camberos, Irene Guerrero, Aylín Aviléz, and Miah Zuazua) at the Estadio Ciudad de los Deportes in Mexico City.

They played three matches in the NWSL x Liga MX Femenil Summer Cup 2024 against U.S. opponents, achieving one victory and two losses. The 7 goals scored against Vancouver Whitecaps included four in the first half.

- **Nicolette Hernández (USA)**. Involved in the first two goals in the 7-0 win over Vancouver (1 goal and 1 assist). Made 31 passes, one shot resulting in a goal, and recovered one ball.
- **Sarah Luebbert (USA)**. Scored 1 goal and provided 1 assist against Vancouver Whitecaps. The American forward made 6 shots (4 on goal, 1 goal, and 1 hit the post).
- **Kimberly Rodríguez (MEX**). Was the player with the most passes (60) and recovered balls (3) against Vancouver Whitecaps. Completed 94% of her passes and made 3 clearances.

Alajuelense (CRC) vs. Gotham (USA)

Alajuelense made their debut in the Concacaf W Champions Cup 2024-25 with a 5-0 victory against Frazsiers Whip of Jamaica at the Alejandro Morera Soto Stadium, Alajuela.

The five goals scored were all from open play and in the first half, in addition to making 27 shots, six on goal, two hitting the posts, and 14 off-target.

The champions of the Apertura and Clausura 2023 in Costa Rica achieved 65% possession in the first match.

- Ángela Mesén (CRC). Scored two goals in the 5-0 win in Alajuela. The forward played in the FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup 2022. With the senior national team, she has played in 7 matches in 2024, including 2 in the qualifiers for the Concacaf Gold Cup W 2024.

- María Paula Coto (CRC). Scored the first goal for Alajuelense in the history of the CWCC. The defender made 40 passes, took 3 shots, and recovered 3 balls.
- **Natalia Mills (PAN)**. The Panamanian forward participated in 2 of the 5 goals against Frazsiers Whip with one goal and one assist, also made 4 shots (1 goal, 1 shot on target, 1 hit the post, and 1 off-target).



NJ/NY Gotham FC will debut in the CWCC 2024-25.

The team is based in Harrison, New Jersey, and was founded in 2006 as Jersey Sky Blue, later known as Sky Blue FC from 2008 to 2020.

They have been champions of the National Women's Soccer League (NWSL) twice, in 2009 and 2023, with the latter title qualifying them for the CWCC 2024-25. They were runners-up in the NWSL Challenge Cup in 2021.

Gotham FC qualified for the Concacaf W Champions Cup 2024/25 as the NWSL 2023 champions after defeating Seattle Reign 2-1 in the playoff finals. They will be one of the three representatives from the National Women's Soccer League (NWSL) in the tournament.

- **Esther González (ESP)**: The Spanish player was a world champion at the Australia/New Zealand 2023 where she scored 1 goal in five appearances. She scored 10 goals in six appearances during the UEFA qualifiers. She has won the Spanish Superliga title with both Atlético Madrid and Real Madrid.
- Rose Lavelle (USA): She has made 106 appearances with the United States national team, scoring 24 goals and providing 24 assists. Her achievements include winning the FIFA Women's World Cup in 2019, where she also received the Bronze Ball as the tournament's third best player and participating in the 2023 FIFA Women's World Cup and the 2020 Tokyo Olympics.
- **Kelley O'Hara (USA)**: The defender has 160 international caps for the United States, with 3 goals and 21 assists. She was part of the U.S. roster that won the FIFA Women's World Cup twice, in Canada 2015 and France 2019.

Monterrey (MEX) vs. Frazsiers (JAM)

Group A, September 5, 2024 Estadio BBVA, Monterrey.



Monterrey lost 0-4 in the Clásico Regio against Tigres UANL (Maricarmen Reyes, Jennifer Hermoso, Thembi Kgatlana, and Cristina Ferral).

The reigning champions of the Clausura 2024 of the Liga MX Femenil made 7 shots in their debut against Tigres (2 on target and 5 off-target) and received 18 (9 on target, 4 goals, 4 off-target, and 1 against the posts).

Despite the loss, they surpassed their rival in ball possession with 51%, completing 83% of their passes (372 in total) against Tigres.

Highlighted players:

- **Nicole Pérez (MEX)**: Was the player with the most shots (3) and passes (55) against Tigres UANL. At the national team level, she played in the Concacaf U-17 Championships 2018 (3 goals in 4 matches) and U-20 2020 (2 goals in 7 matches).
- **Rebeca Bernal (MEX)**: The captain of Rayadas was the leader in passes (48) and recovered balls (4). The defender has scored 50 goals in Mexican football.
- **Pamela Tajonar (MEX)**: Thanks to her 5 saves and 1 clearance, she prevented a larger scoreline against Tigres. She had a clear outing from the back with 96% passing effectiveness.



Frazsiers Whip debuted in the CWCC 2024-25 with a 5-0 loss away to Alajuelense.

The champions of the Jamaican Women's Premier League 2022/23 put up a strong fight in the first half in Alajuela, with all the conceded goals occurring in the second half.

The team coached by Courtney Dowdie (JAM) made 7 shots against Alajuelense, with 5 in the first 45 minutes.

- Italya Robinson (JAM): Made 3 saves in her CWCC 2024/25 debut (did not concede in the first half). The 16-year-old goalkeeper also made 13 passes with 100% accuracy.
- **Lotoya Duhaney (JAM)**: Was responsible for 57% of the shots (4) against Alajuelense. Three of the forward's shots were on goal and one was off-target.
- **Destiny Powell (JAM)**: Made 4 ball recoveries alongside her teammate Kiona Tuloach. She completed 70% of her passes (19 effective) and took one shot.
