



Vancouver (CAN) vs. Wave (USA)

Group B, October 1st, 2024, BC Place Stadium, Vancouver.

They will face each other for the first time in an international club tournament.



VANCOUVER WHITECAPS FC (CAN)

Vancouver Whitecaps FC will play four matches in the CONCACAF W Champions Cup, the third one in the group stage after overcoming the Preliminary Round against Alianza Women's (1-0).

The Canadian team will play their first home match in the history of the competition following games played in El Salvador (0-1 vs. Alianza FC), Mexico (7-0 vs. América), and Panama (1-2 vs. Santa Fe).

The team, led by coach Katelyn Collar (CAN), achieved an average of 24.3 recovered balls per match in the Concacaf tournament (the most of which were in the first half).

Record in the CWCC 2024/25: GP-3 W-2 D-0 L-1 (3GF-8GA). *Including their participation in the 2024/25 Preliminary Round (vs. Alianza Women).

Top scorers: Emily Wong (CAN) 1, Brianne Reed (USA), Jourdan Ziff (USA).

Assists: Zahra Bains (CAN) 1, Kaylee Hunter (CAN).

Saves: 11. Goalkeeper: Morgan Mcaslan (CAN) 11.

Opportunities to score (15), shots on goal (7).

Standout players:

Emily Wong (CAN). Scored the goal that sealed Vancouver Whitecaps' qualification in the Preliminary Round against Alianza FC. The 17-year-old midfielder leads in passes (85%) and 10 ball recoveries.

Téa Mayson (CAN). She is the player with the most passes (80) in the Canadian team and has played all three matches, making 62 passes and 8 ball recoveries.

Kaylee Hunter (CAN). Provided 1 assist and was the player with the most shots (3) in the 2-1 victory over Santa Fe at the Universidad de Penonomé Stadium. In total, she has made six shots.



SAN DIEGO WAVE (USA)

San Diego Wave FC will play their third match after defeating Santa Fe 2-0 (Maria Sanchez and Kristen McNabb) in Panama and Thorns 3-2 in the United States.

The 2023 NWSL Shield champions scored 80% of their goals, with 2 from penalties and 2 from headers.

They will play as visitors for the second time (0-2 vs. Santa Fe). The team coached by Landon Donovan (USA) has not conceded any goals in the first half of the current tournament.

Top scorers: María Sánchez (USA) 4, Kristen McNabb (USA).

Assists: Hanna Lundkvist (SWE) 1, Delphine Cascarino (FRA) 1.

Opportunities to score goals (31), shots on goal (15).

Standout players:

María Sánchez (USA). Scored 80% of San Diego Wave's goals (vs. Santa Fe and a hat-trick vs. Thorns) and has made (10) shots. She scored 2 penalty goals, 1 header, and 1 from open play.

Naomi Girma (USA). In her debut, she led in passes (86) in the 3-2 victory vs. Portland Thorns in week 3. The defender has 39 appearances for the US women's national team.

Hanna Lundkvist (SWE). The 22-year-old defender leads in passes with (113). She has played 180 minutes and provided 1 assist in her debut.
