

Costa Rica vs. Cuba - Group A

Costa Rica and Cuba will face each other for the second time in the group stage of the tournament, with the previous encounter being on August 1, 1980, in the United States in Group A, a 3-1 win for Costa Rica. Since that game, Costa Rica has achieved a streak of three consecutive wins, including the final on April 24, 1988, in Guatemala, with a 4-1 win for Costa Rica.

Cuba's only win in the series against Costa Rica was 2-1 in the quarterfinals on February 26, 2013, in Mexico, with goals for Cuba by Aricheell Hernández (13', 80') and for Costa Rica by David Gerardo Ramírez (40').



Absent from the FIFA U-20 Men's World Cup since 2017, Costa Rica will seek in Mexico to secure one of Concacaf's four tickets to Chile 2025.

Champions in the 1998 and 2009 editions, in addition to two runner-up finishes in 1994 and 2011, Costa Rica will be one of the strong contenders in the CMU20 in Mexico.

The top scorer for Costa Rica in the CMU20 is Joel Campbell with 6 goals.

In nine appearances in the FIFA U-20 Men's World Cup, Costa Rica achieved its best result when it finished fourth in Egypt in 2009.

Costa Rica's rivals in Group A will be the United States, Cuba, and Jamaica.

Last appearance in the final round: Honduras 2022 (quarterfinals).

Footballers to watch:

- Claudio Montero. The midfielder made 4 appearances in the 2023 Concacaf U-17 Championship in Guatemala and played in the Central American Cup where he won the title with LD Alajuelense.
- **Andry Naranjo.** The 17-year-old defender participated in the 2023 Concacaf U-17 Championship in Guatemala, scoring a goal in 4 appearances.



After winning Group A of the qualifiers for the 2024 CMU20, Cuba will seek to advance to the knockout phase in Group A against the United States, Costa Rica, and Jamaica, aiming to return to the FIFA U-20 Men's World Cup, in which they have only participated once, in Turkey in 2013. David Pérez and Marcos Campos each scored three goals in the qualifiers for Mexico.

Cuba achieved two runner-up finishes in 1970 and 1974 and finished fourth for the last time in 2013.

The top scorer for Cuba in the CMU20 is Geobel Pérez with 5 goals.

Last appearance in the final round: Honduras 2022 (round of 16).

Footballers to watch:

David Perez: He was the leader in shots with (4), the most shots (17), and goals scored (3) in the group stage of the Concacaf qualifiers for the 2024 Concacaf U-20 Championship against Nicaragua.

Marcos Campos: He scored 3 goals in 4 matches in the qualifiers for the 2024 Concacaf U-20 Championship (100% of plays and all in the first half). He had a shot accuracy of 43%.
