

#84 Barbados vs. Guyana

Barbados and Guyana have a rich history. In 22 previous matches, Guyana achieved 9 wins, 7 draws, and six losses, scoring 35 goals and conceding 3.

The last time they faced each other was in an international friendly on March 27, 2022, with a 5-0 win for Guyana, featuring goals from Quincy Adams, Pernell Schultz, Omari Glasgow (x2), and Neil Danns at Hasely Crawford Stadium, Port of Spain (Mar 27, 2022).

The rivalry extended to the 2019/20 Concacaf Nations League qualifiers.

In Round 1 of 2018/19, Guyana claimed a 3-0 victory. The match originally ended in a 2-2 draw at the Synthetic Track and Field Facility; however, the Concacaf Disciplinary Committee awarded a 3-0 win to Guyana after Barbados fielded two ineligible players (Hallam Hope and Krystian Pearce).

They also met in the Concacaf qualifiers for the FIFA World Cup Brazil 2014 (2011-2013), with both matches resulting in identical scores in favor of Guyana (2-0 and 0-2).

Players to Watch:

- Niall Reid-Stephen. Was the top scorer in League C of the CNL 2024/25 with 6 goals in his last 3 matches (including a brace and a hat-trick against the U.S. Virgin Islands). He led in shots with (23). He has scored 8 goals in his last 6 matches.
- André Applewhaite. Scored 2 of Barbados' last 6 goals. He made 8 of the 89 shots in Group A of League C in the CNL 2024/25 (3 goals).
- **Kishmar Primus.** Achieved two clean sheets in 3 recent CNL matches (both against the U.S. Virgin Islands). The goalkeeper has a total of 36 saves.

Players to Watch:

- Isaiah Jones. He was Guyana's top scorer in League A of the CNL 2024/25, thanks to his brace against Martinique. He played all 4 matches, completed 90% of his passes, and made 6 shots.
- Omari Glasgow. He is Guyana's all-time top scorer in the CNL (11). He led in shots with (11) prior to the Play-In. In the 2023-24 edition, he was the top scorer in League B with 7 goals.
- Nathan Moriah-Welsh. Provided the assist for Stephen Duke-McKenna's goal and was the player with the most passes (131). The midfielder has scored 3 goals across the 2022/23 (1) and 2023/24 (2) editions.
