

Puerto Rico 6-0 U.S. Virgin Islands (Group B)

Puerto Rico reaches 40 matches played in the competition, with a record of 20 wins, 3 draws, and 17 losses, scoring 103 goals and conceding 76. With this victory, the Boricuas ended a three-match losing streak.

This marks the third time Puerto Rico has endured a run of three consecutive defeats, previously happening between 2004 and 2012, then from 2018 to 2020, and most recently in 2023.

Puerto Rico scored six goals in a single qualifying match for the third time, but this is the first occasion they have done so in the opening group stage fixture. The previous instances were a 6-0 victory over Antigua & Barbuda in 2018 and a 6-1 win against the Cayman Islands in 2023.

Puerto Rico secured its second win in as many matches against the U.S. Virgin Islands. The two sides had not faced each other since the inaugural edition in Trinidad & Tobago in 2002, when Puerto Rico claimed a 4-0 victory. More than 23 years, 1 month, and 8 days have passed since that encounter.

Meanwhile, the U.S. Virgin Islands extended their winless streak to six matches (5 losses and 1 draw), the longest such run in their history in World Cup qualifying.

The U.S. Virgin Islands suffered their 12th defeat in 19 World Cup qualifying matches, and for the first time, they lost a game by a 6-0 scoreline.

Costa Rica 4-0 Aruba (Group F)

Costa Rica put an end to a three-match losing streak and, with this victory, also snapped a run of seven consecutive games conceding goals. This marks the 21st time the Costa Rican national team has kept a clean sheet in 61 matches played.

This was Costa Rica's 40th victory in Concacaf Women's U-20 history, solidifying its position as the Central American team with the most wins. It was also the fourth time Costa Rica secured a 4-0 victory. The Ticas hadn't won a match by this scoreline since the 2011 edition, when they defeated Honduras on Matchday 2 of Group A in the Central American preliminary round—13 years, 6 months, and 2 days ago.

Costa Rica has now won six of its seven group stage openers in Concacaf U-20 Women's qualifying. The only time the Ticas lost their opening match was in the 2011 edition, when they fell 3-1 to Guatemala—13 years, 6 months, and 4 days ago.

Aruba suffered its third defeat in as many matches, remaining scoreless while conceding 14 goals. Aruba returned to action in the Concacaf Women's U-20 qualifiers after 11 years, 7 months, and 7 days since their last match—a 5-0 loss to the Dominican Republic in the 2014 edition in the Cayman Islands.

Jamaica 7-0 Saint Vincent & the Grenadines (Group D)

Jamaica secured its second consecutive victory in Concacaf U-20 Women's qualifying. With this win, the Reggae Girlz ended a streak of three straight matches conceding goals, recording their 42nd clean sheet in World Cup qualifying history.

This was Jamaica's third-ever 7-0 victory, and the first since defeating Bermuda on Matchday 1 of Group D in the first round of the Caribbean preliminary phase of the 2014 edition in the Cayman Islands—11 years, 6 months, and 25 days ago.

Jamaica extended its streak to eight consecutive wins in group stage openers of Concacaf U-20 qualifying, having now won 12 of 13 such matches. Their last defeat in a group stage opener dates back to a 1-0 loss to Haiti in the 2012 edition in Panama—13 years, 1 month, and 14 days ago, which remains their only loss in this type of match.

Saint Vincent & the Grenadines is now winless in 14 straight matches (4 draws, 10 losses) and suffered its 19th defeat in 24 tournament matches. Additionally, this was their first-ever 7-0 loss.

This was the 17th match in which Saint Vincent & the Grenadines failed to score. It is now the third-longest scoreless streak by any Caribbean national team, trailing only Jamaica and Saint Kitts & Nevis with 19 games and Trinidad & Tobago with 18.

El Salvador 1-0 Honduras

El Salvador extended its unbeaten streak against Honduras in Concacaf Women's Under 20 to three matches (2 wins, 1 draw), securing back-to-back victories over their Central American rivals. This was also the first time El Salvador kept a clean sheet against Honduras.

This was the 23rd time El Salvador faced a Central American opponent, reaching eight wins in that span. The Salvadorans have now won four of their last five matches against teams from the region. Their last encounter against a Central American side in the Preliminary Phase came in a 2-1 loss to Nicaragua in the 2018 edition in Haiti.

El Salvador recorded its fourth-ever 1-0 victory, the first by that scoreline since defeating Guatemala 1-0 in the 2020 edition in the Dominican Republic.

Honduras reached 30 matches played in its history, with a record of 8 wins, 3 draws, and 19 losses, scoring 37 goals and conceding 100.

Honduras became the third Central American team to concede 100 goals in the history of the Concacaf Women's U-20 qualifiers, trailing Panama (113 goals conceded) and Nicaragua (133 goals conceded).

Guatemala 3-0 Cayman Islands

Guatemala reached 40 matches played in the history of the Concacaf Women's U-20, with a record of 17 wins, 6 draws, and 17 losses, scoring 69 goals and conceding 89.

Guatemala secured its third win in its last four matches (3 wins, 1 loss) and kept a clean sheet in three of its last four games—an unprecedented feat for the Guatemalan squad.

This was Guatemala's second-ever 3-0 victory, with the last one coming against Belize in the 2023 edition in the Dominican Republic. Additionally, it marked Guatemala's third win in six group stage openers, with their last opening match victory being a 2-0 win over El Salvador in the 2024 edition in the Cayman Islands.

The Cayman Islands suffered their fifth consecutive tournament defeat, bringing their total to 16 losses in 21 matches in competition history. In their last 16 matches, they have now lost 13 times.

This was the Cayman Islands' second loss in as many matches against Central American opponents. Their only previous meeting resulted in a 3-0 defeat to Honduras on Matchday 3 of Group B in the 2014 Final Tournament in the Cayman Islands, where Linda Moncada scored twice and Johana López added the third for Honduras.

Nicaragua 8-0 Saint Kitts and Nevis

Nicaragua secured its fourth victory in its last five matches (4 wins, 1 loss) and recorded back-to-back clean sheets. This was the fifth time Nicaragua kept a clean sheet in the tournament and the second time against a Caribbean opponent, having previously done so against Saint Lucia in 2023 and Saint Kitts & Nevis in 2025.

Nicaragua set a new record for the most goals scored in a single match in tournament history with eight, surpassing the five goals they scored against Belize in the 2018 edition on Matchday 1 of Group A in the Central American Preliminary Phase (June 18, 2017).

Nicaragua joins Panama as the only Central American teams to win a tournament match with an 8-0 scoreline. The Panamanians achieved this feat against Nicaragua in the 2002 edition on Matchday 1 of Group A in the first phase of Central America (March 20, 2002).

Saint Kitts & Nevis reached 35 matches played in tournament history, with a record of 9 wins, 1 draw, and 25 losses, scoring 51 goals and conceding 150. The team now holds the record for the most goals conceded by a Caribbean nation in the history of Concacaf Women's U-20 Qualifying, averaging 4.3 goals allowed per game.
