COSTA RICA vs. HONDURAS

Toyota Stadium, Arlington

Honduras and Costa Rica will face each other for the second time in the Concacaf Nations League. In the first match, they drew (2-2) in the third-place match, with goals from Edwin Rodríguez and Albert Elis for Honduras and Joel Campbell and Francisco Calvo for Costa Rica. Subsequently, Honduras won on penalties 5-4 on June 6, 2021, at Empower Field at Mile High in Denver.

Memorable moments from the Costa Rica vs. Honduras series:

Costa Rica 3-3 Honduras (Wálter Elizondo, Roy Sáenz, and an own goal by Selvin Cárcamo; Jorge Urquía and Rigoberto Gómez x2), Group 3 of the qualifiers for the Concacaf Nations Cup 1972, which served as qualifiers for the FIFA World Cup Germany 1974. With this draw, Honduras, with 10 men, eliminated Costa Rica at La Sabana Stadium in San José.

UNCAF Central American Cup (semifinal 1995 and final in 2005), Gold Cup (quarter-finals 2011), or in the Concacaf Nations League (third-place match in 2019/20).

Central American Cup 1995 (Semifinal): Honduras 1-1 (4-2) Costa Rica. Honduras advanced to the Final. The goals for Honduras were scored by Rudy Williams and Rolando Fonseca for Costa Rica, at Cuscatlán Stadium, SLV (Dec 7, 1995).

Central American Cup 2005 (Final): Costa Rica 1-1 Honduras (7-6) on penalties. Costa Rica won the title. The goals in Regular Time were from Whayne Wilson for Costa Rica and Milton Núñez for Honduras, at Mateo Flores Stadium, Guatemala, Feb 27, 2005.

Gold Cup 2011 (Quarter-finals): Costa Rica 1-1 (2-4) Honduras. Honduras advanced to the Semifinals. The goals in Regular Time were scored by Dennis Marshall for Costa Rica and Jerry Bengtson for Honduras, at the New Meadowlands Stadium (Baltimore, USA), Jun 18, 2011.

In their last 7 encounters, Costa Rica has an advantage with 2 wins and 5 draws. Honduras hasn't been able to beat Costa Rica since October 11, 2013, in the Concacaf qualifiers for the 2014 FIFA World Cup in San Pedro Sula, with a 1-0 scoreline, with a goal by Jerry Bengtson in the 64th minute. It has been over 10 years since Honduras last defeated Costa Rica.

This streak of 7 winless games for Honduras against Costa Rica is the second longest. The first occurred between 1930 and 1960, during which Honduras lost 6 games and only managed 1 draw, scoring 5 goals compared to Costa Rica's 32.

Players to watch

Francisco Calvo. He is the top scorer for Costa Rica in the Concacaf Nations League with (5). Additionally, he scored the only goal in the quarterfinals against Panama.

Yeltsin Tejeda. He had a passing accuracy of (96%) in the quarterfinal match against Panama.

Joel Campbell. Provided the assist for Costa Rica's only goal in the quarterfinals of CNL 2023/24. Campbell has scored two goals in the CNL.

Players to watch

Jerry Bengtson. He returned to the Honduras National Team after his last participation in the 2023 Concacaf Gold Cup, where he scored a goal against Haiti in the closing match of the group stage. The forward has scored **180 goals** in the National League of Honduras, making him the active top scorer in national football (he is 16 goals away from the all-time top scorer in the First Division of Honduras, Wilmer Velásquez with 196).

Edwin Rodriguez. He scored 3 goals in 28 matches with Honduras. His 3 goals came in the Concacaf Nations League (he scored against Costa Rica in the 3rd Place match of the 2019/20 CNL and a brace against Grenada in Group B of League A 2023/24). In the current edition, he has scored 2 goals, provided 2 assists, and attempted 8 shots.

Andy Najar. He has played in 4 matches in the 2023/24 Concacaf Nations League where Honduras kept 2 clean sheets. The right-back defender has scored 4 goals in 46 appearances. He was one of the players with the most balls recovered alongside Edwin Rodriguez with (7); the leader was Deybi Flores with (9).

Deybi Flores. He led in passes (288) and balls recovered (9) in addition to 6 shots in the Honduras team in the current CNL.
